2 BILLS PASSED ON THE STRENGTH OF REPUBLICAN VOTES

H.R. 2206 – U.S. Troop Readiness, Veterans' Care, Katrina Recovery, & Iraq Accountability Appropriations Act (Emergency Supplemental)

- Democrats delayed critical troop funding for 108 days insisting that the supplemental contain surrender dates that would have handcuffed our generals and telegraphed timelines to our enemies. **Republicans remained united** in the fight to ensure that our troops received the resources they needed and to force Democrats to drop these dangerous timetables.

S. 1927 – Protect America Act

- Democrats delayed action on modernizing FISA laws that give our intelligence and counter intelligence officials the ability to monitor communication among suspected terrorists. **Republicans successfully fought to close the terrorist loophole once and for all.**
